

BUILDWAS ACADEMY PE & SPORTS PREMIUM STATEMENT

Background

The primary school sport premium is £320 million per annum of new government funding jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. Investment will go direct to individual primary school Headteachers and is designed to support improvements in the quality and depth of PE and school sport.

The Department for Education's Outcomes

All young people should have the opportunity to live healthy and active lives. Sport and physical activity improve our children's physical and mental wellbeing, and help them to develop important skills like teamwork and leadership. A positive experience of sport and physical activity at a young age can build a lifetime habit of participation. Physical literacy (building physical competency alongside confidence, enjoyment, knowledge and understanding) and high quality, modern physical education (PE) lessons that engage boys and girls of different backgrounds and abilities should be a fundamental part of every child's school experience.

Ensuring young people have access to the right amount of daily activity can have wider benefits for pupils and schools, improving behaviour as well as enhancing learning and academic achievement. Sport has also been

identified by the Department for Education as one of the five foundations for building character, helping young people develop resilience, determination and self-belief, and instilling values and virtues such as friendship and fair play. It can help children and young people to connect with their peers, tackling loneliness and social isolation and building stronger communities.
