I recently attended a conference about building up resilience, and how children develop their short and long-term memories to help improve recall, and help them tap into learning strategies so they can build on their new learning. This was all very exciting stuff for me as it is something that was successfully implemented in my previous school. ### **Buildwas Rocks:**

In **Willow class** this week we have been continuing to learn about the circus. We practised some circus skills outside using a variety of props like stilts, scarves, bikes and wooden planks. We learnt about how to stay safe on the internet when using our iPad and tablets at home and in school. We enjoyed sharing the types of games we like to play. Following our story book 'Circus in the sky', we spent some time learning about day and night and the different things we would see. Using a light projector, we looked at what the night sky would look like. We discussed how we would see the stars and the moon. We then used our artistic talents of paint flicking to create a night time sky on black sugar paper. In maths Reception have been looking at measuring height and length and then looked at the days of the week. In nursery they have been consolidating their understanding of numbers to 5, counting, subitising and recognising. This week we have been looking at the Makaton sign for 'Police officer'.

This week **Beech Class** have been VERY busy! We've been doing lots and lots of our spy quizzes with Miss Lockley, showing off our fabulous reading and maths skills. We've worked so hard and we're all so proud of ourselves! On Wednesday, some of us were lucky enough to go to William Brookes and partake in the MAD sports event. The children who went all really enjoyed the different activities. The children who didn't go to the MAD event had a lovely time in Beech Class with Mrs Poole finishing off our fire engines. We worked together to think of the best ways to make ladders, sirens and lights.

**Oak class** have really been intrigued by our English class story 'The Wisp' based on a child refugee living a camp. They have engaged well and extended their vocabulary using well-structured sentences and some great imaginative ideas! We have been consolidating our learning in maths, we are currently assessing what the children have learnt across the term and enabling them to move forwards. We have some budding artists in our class, and they have definitely demonstrated their skills in their David Hockney landscape paintings this term.
