### **Buildwas Rocks:**

In **Beech** Class this week, we have continued to really enjoy our science and art topics. We came in on Tuesday morning to see that our sunflowers were growing tall and fast! We were all so enthusiastic to observe the changes they had made! We were then spectacular sculptors in art. This time, we used straws and elastic bands to create abstract structures and shapes. It was very difficult to wrap the bands around our straws, but we all loved it and were so proud of the masterpieces we created! On Thursday, we were terrific tree scientists! We used our fantastic observation skills to update out sunflower diary with the changes they were making and then we used the same observation skills to compare the similarities and differences between the parts of a tree and parts of a flowering plant. We then took our learning outside! We each had a clipboard, pencil and watercolours. We chose a tree each and sketched it before we painted it! We loved this activity so much – we were so focused. On Friday, we learnt all about the coronation and why its important. We created some beautiful crafts for the special occasion.

In **Oak** Class the hundreds group had a maths assessment on all the work that they have done on length and perimeter. They then marked their own test papers, identifying misconceptions and learning from them. The thousands group are continuing their work on decimals, which they have been positioning on number lines. In English, the children have evaluated and edited last week's independent writes, using this information to help them think about the next steps they need to work on. We have created new pieces in music combining electronic rhythms and pulses on Purple Mash. In our Geography work we are researching the island of Crete, which we will go on to compare with the location of Telford.















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
