In other news:

- Only pre-school parents should be on the playground in the morning, all other children should be left at the gate. This is to help encourage independence in the children.

In maths reception have been looking at composition of numbers up to 10 and looking at patterns, which we have become very good at! Preschool have continued to recap and recall their knowledge and understanding of 2D shapes focusing on rectangles, circles and triangles. We enjoyed completing lots of different art activities on Art day all around our theme 'Under the sea'.

This week in Oak Class we have done some background research for our trip to Much Wenlock next week by studying the Ancient Greek Olympic games and comparing them to the modern ones. We have been impressed with the way that the Ancient Greeks had a truce for a month so that athletes could make their way to Olympia for the games without















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
